The school has lived and worked in high rise buildings in the Sydney CBD for many years, utilising space and place to enhance teaching and learning opportunities.

Learning in the heart of one of the world's greatest cities gives students the advantage they need to move confidently into the future and make a significant contribution to the world in the city of Sydney or in cities around the globe.

Due to the city centric location real-life learning are woven into the curriculum as it interfaces dynamically with the city, students experiencing vibrancy both in and out of the classroom.
