**Located on the former Kitchener Park site adjacent to the former Subiaco Oval site, Stage 1 of Bob Hawke College opened its doors on Monday 3 February to approximately 260 Year 7 students.**

With a capacity of 1000 students Stage 1 delivered most of the school's facilities including:

- \* General classrooms
- \* administration and student services
- \* health and physical education
- \* design and technology
- \* food and technology
- \* auditorium

- \* library
- \* science and information technology laboratories
- \* cafeteria and terraced dining area
- \* internal courtyards
- \* playing courts.

Facilities have been constructed across below ground, ground, first and second floor levels on a 1.8ha site, far smaller than a standard high school site.

It is intended that Stage Two will be built and completed for the start of 2023, increasing the schools capacity to 2000.

Stage Two facilities will be located in the Northern portion of the site and will include:

- \* Additional general use classrooms
- \* performing arts centre
- \* visual arts
- \* media facilities
- \* additional student services facilities

The school will have exclusive use of Subiaco Oval during school hours and it is expected that hard court facilities will be provided by one of the land parcels surrounding the oval now that the grandstands have all been demolished.
