The new Library and Pavilion were opened in August 2019. Once the home of the Marrickville Hospital, the heritage building has been retained and restored as a new library, which epitomises the “Theme of Sustainable Education” and is a progressive model in terms of sustainability.

Throughout the afternoon, you will experience a guided tour led by representatives from BVN Architecture and the Library. You will then hear from the Staff of Marrickville Library, an Aboriginal Educator on issues of Aboriginal Literacies and a School Librarian who has enlivened a library space.
