
CREATIVE INDUSTRIES PRECINCT QUEENSLAND UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY, KELVIN GROVE WEDNESDAY 23 NOVEMBER 2016 at 2:30 pm

The Creative Industries Precinct was expanded in 2016 to become a world-class, multipurpose education facility comprising teaching spaces, office accommodation and specialist teaching studios for the creative arts faculty (music, dance, drama and visual arts).



At Kelvin Grove, the Creative Industries Precinct is the heart of a creative community. The University's visual arts, animation, performance and production, writing and communication, fashion and interactive and visual design students learn, practise and perform in the precinct.

Enhanced by an \$80 million expansion in 2016, the Creative Industries precinct is the most sophisticated and high-tech

creative education space in Australia.

With an emphasis on transparency, digital connectivity and interdisciplinary collaboration, the design makes the creative process more visible and creates a vibrant learning environment that fosters connections and collaborations between students, staff and researchers working in different disciplines.

From the natural lighting flooding in from the building's east, to the recycled timber on the wooden stairs, sustainability has been a key feature of the building since day one.



The precinct houses a mix of purpose-built and flexible spaces, including:

- technology-equipped exhibition spaces and galleries
- an auditorium-quality music performance and recording studio, plus soundproofed rehearsal studios
- acoustically isolated 'box in box' recording suites
- a purpose-built digital music studio with multiple production workstations
- dance and movement studios with flooring optimised for grip and rebound
- a construction workshop outfitted with wood and metal working equipment, clean construction spaces, spray booth and digitally equipped training room



- an animation and digital visual studio featuring high powered animation software
- industry standard newsrooms, radio and TV studios, editing suites and production offices

In addition to viewing this magnificent new building, guests will have the opportunity to tour recently refurbished heritage buildings that form part of the precinct.
